MATHURA: The district court in Mathura, on Tuesday, delivered a verdict on an incident of 1985, convicting 11 police personnel for an encounter in which Raja Mansingh was killed in Bharatpur, Rajasthan. Raja Mansingh was killed in a police encounter in Bharatpur, thirty-five years ago. A day before the encounter, he had banged his jeep into stationary helicopter of then Rajasthan chief minister. The Supreme Court had transferred the case to Mathura from Rajasthan. The quantum of punishment for the convicted police personnel will be announced on Wednesday.

The statement said the MLAs in the meeting expressed faith in the leadership of Gehlot, saying they will "together win the battle of truth". Senior party leaders, including AICC general secretary in-charge for the Rajasthan Congress Avinash Pande; K C Venugopal; Ajay Maken; Randeep Surjewala; Vivek Bansal and Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot attended the meeting. The 2021 Assembly election are less than a year away and West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee waved her magic wand to foresee victory for the Trinamool Congress (TMC) for a third term, while speaking at the virtual Shahid Diwas rally on Tuesday. Banerjee Tuesday accused the Centre of "hatching conspiracies" to pull down the governments in oppositionruled states by employing federal agencies and money power, and branded the BJP as the "most destructive" party.

Invoking Bengali subnationalism, Banerjee termed BJP an "outsider" in West Bengal and said the state should not be ruled by "Gujarat and out-

siders but by the people of the soil". Banerjee alleged the Centre has deprived Bengal of resources and asserted people will give a befitting reply to it for the injustice.

"A conspiracy is being hatched by the union government to destabilise the elected government of Bengal by using central agencies and money power. BJP is the most destructive party the country has ever seen.

"When the country is busy fighting the COVID pandemic, the BJP is busy destabilising the elected governments in Rajasthan and West Bengal after Madhya Pradesh," she said.

"Why should Gujarat rule all states? We won't tolerate this rule of two brothers (Narendra Modi and Amit Shah).

What's the need for a federal structure? Create a 'one nation-one party' system then," she said, in a scathing

"maligning, insulting and depriving" the people of West Bengal, she said, before pointing fingers at her state the centre should talk about the "jungle raj and encounter raj" in Uttar Pradesh. "Centre is conspiring against Bengal, saying every day there is violence and lawlessness. What about UP where jungle raj prevails. People there are afraid about even lodging a police complaint. Several police officers were killed in a single incident. The main culprit was killed in a so-called encounter to hide the truth," she said.

Indicating that the controversial National Population Register (NPR) and National Register of Citizens (NRC) will be the TMC's major electoral planks in the assembly polls, Banerjee said the people of West Bengal have not forgotten "how innocent people were killed during the Delhi riots and genuine citizens thrown into detention camps in Assam".

Banerjee alleged the NPR and NRC were tools to create rift between communities. "What citizenship is the BJP talking about? The refugees (from Bangladesh) have already got citizenship," she said.

"An attempt is being made to stir up communal disharmony. A party is trying to incite Hindu-Muslim riots. Remember that people of all faiths are equal. This country....

Bengal...is for all, Banerjee said. Accusing the Centre of not extending any help to the state government post-cyclone Amphan apart from the Rs 1,000 crore interim aid, the chief minister said the state announced a Rs 6,500 crore relief package mobilising its own resources.

The India-China talks on military de-escalation in Ladakh along the Line of Actual Control has hit a minor roadblock as China is not fully adhering to the agreement on creating a physical buffer zone and going back from certain grey areas, defence ministry sources said.

They said a fresh physical verification of the buffer zone will be made as the previous one shows a partial pullback by China that does not match the agreement at the meeting of the top military commanders. The two sides have to move back 1.5 km on each side of the approximate LAC, which has not happened.

The clear demarcations were the outcome of discussions between the two sides following the bloody confrontation of June 15 in which 20 Indian soldiers were martyred and an unspecified number of Chinese troops were killed in the Galwan Valley.

Another meeting at the Lieutenant General level commanders is possible only after some movement is visible on the ground. There are at least two points where the Chinese People's Liberation Army (PLA) has not created a buffer. At PP 17-A (Gogra), the distance between the two armies is not complete as it is narrower than the ideal 1.5 km on

Lalji Tandon, who brought Maya, BJP together KANCHAN SRIVASTAVA joined the RSS at 12, Tandon began his political journey in early Lucknow

A seasoned politician Lalji Tandon (85), Madhya Pradesh Governor who breathed his last on Tuesday morning in his hometown Lucknow, had a dominating presence in Uttar Pradesh where he served as cabinet minister and was elected to the assembly and council multiple times.

Belonging to the Atal Bihari Vajpayee and L K Advani era of BJP leaders, Tandon, who died at a hospital in Lucknow early Tuesday, proved himself as an able administrator during his decadeslong political career in Uttar Pradesh. Tandon was the governor of Bihar between August 2018 and July 2019 and then took charge in MP.

In a political career spanning several decades, Tandon has served as a councillor, a UP minister, a member of Parliament from Lucknow. In the 1970s, he also actively participated in Jayaprakash Narayan nationwide movement against the then Indira Gandhi government.

Now, his son Ashutosh Tandon, is a cabinet minister in the Yogi government.



MP Chief Minister Shivraj Chauhan and Defence minister Rainath Singh reached Lucknow to pay homage to the leader whose last rites were performed Tuesday evening. PM Modi tweeted his condolences: "Shri Lalji Tandon will be remembered for his untiring efforts to serve society. He played a key role in strengthening the BJP in UP. He made a mark as an effective administrator, always giving importance to public welfare. Anguished by his passing away." Two more UP leaders Ram Naresh Yadav and Ram Prakash Gupta had died while they were MP Governor, senior leaders re-

Brother for Mayawati, instrumental in forming BSP-BJP govt Lalji Tandon was born in Lucknow on April 12, 1935. While he

1960s. He went on to become an MLA and a minister in UP.

In 1995, when Mayawati withdrew her support from the alliance government with Mulayan Singh Yadav, Samajwadi Party members confined her and launched a physical and verbal attack on her in the State guest house. It was Tandon who rescued her with the help of another BJP

Later, Tandon helped bring two ideological rivals BSP and BJP together. Mayawati became the Uttar Pradesh CM 4times, 3 times (1995, 1997 and 2002) with BJP support though for brief stints. She used to tie a rakhi to Tan-

don and fondly called her brother. Mayawati on Tuesday condoled his demise and remembered Tandon as "A very cultured and social person."

Tandon was known as a protege of the late PM AB Vajpayee. In 2009, he took over from his mentor, replacing him as the BJP's Lok Sabha candidate for the Lucknow constituency. He used to seek Vajpayee's bless-

ings before carrying out any im-

portant work. He even campaigned in 2009 elections saying he had come carrying "Vajpayee's sandals". Tandon registered a mammoth victory in those elections. In 2014, his close aide Rajnath Singh got the ticket from Lucknow. After an exile of four years, he was made Bihar governor in 2018.

CONTROVERSIES

During the 2004 LS poll, when Vajpayee was in the fray, Tandon as his election agent held a saree distribution event that led to a stampede which killed 21 people. He was booked under criminal charges on the orders of the Election Commission but later received a clean chit in the case. During the 2007 UP assembly poll campaign, the Election Commission had registered an FIR against him in a case of distributing some controversial CDs.

Tandon also courted through his book "Ankaha Lucknow" released in 2018, in which he claimed that Lucknow was being deliberately transformed into "the city of Nawabi Tehzeeb" hinting at the alleged Muslim appeasement of the Samajwadi party which ruled the state till 2017 February.

116 animals died in flooded Kaziranga park so far, 143 rescued

With over 90 per cent of land and forest areas in Assam's Kaziranga National Park flooded by rainwater, at least 116 wild animals have been killed so far due to drowning or vehicle-hits even as 143 animals have been rescued, officials said on Tuesday.

Officials of the Forest Department and Kaziranga Park, a World Heritage site, said many tigers and rhinos had strayed into nearby villages and higher locations due to flooding of their habitats.

Park and Assam State Disaster Management Authority (ASDMA) officials said over 90 per cent of the park's 430 sq km area was now flooded, with traffic movement on the National Highway-37 near Kaziranga now suspended. According to the officials,

seven wild boars, four wild buffaloes, two swamp deer, two porcupines and one sambar and one python had so far perished in the floodwater or after hits by vehicles on the National Highway-37. Of the rescued animals, 110 were hog deer, four tigers, two rhinos, 17 pythons,

11 rhinos, 88 hog deer,

that 16 hog deers were killed during treatment while 117 animals were released into the forest area after they were treated. Park Director P.
